Planning High School

- Plan a rigorous curriculum
- Be prepared to meet college requirements
- Use the Planning Guide frequently
- Exceed requirements for big scholarships
- Specialization, delight directed learning
- Work skills, life skills, and character

Preparing for College

Take the PSAT: 10th grade fun, 11th grade profit Junior year tasks are critical. Plan these steps:

- Fall: PSAT in October, attend college fairs
- Spring: visit colleges, SAT or ACT in spring
- Decide on colleges where you will apply
- Parents complete all high school records

Finding a College

- First step is attending a college fair
- Research college statistics carefully
- Visit the college and take notes. Visiting a college is the ONLY way to know it's a fit
- Ivy League aspirations: research colleges early, exceed expectations, have a back-up plan
- All students should apply to at least 4-8 colleges, with Reach, Fit, and Safety Schools.

Applying to College

- Complete college applications early, before Thanksgiving in senior year
- Application essays take time; long, self-reflective, technically perfect essays
- Parents complete and send all homeschool records

Getting Scholarships

- National Merit Scholarship: PSAT junior year, junior year SAT, homeschool records
- Private scholarship search: find, filter, format, follow though, file experience in transcript
- Scholarships increase with test preparation, scholarship competitions and interviews
- Count the true cost of colleges, the cost out of pocket.
- Scholarships come in waves during senior year: based on tests, based on need, based on merit
